VOYABULARY LIST



This vocabulary list provides the meaning of the words and phrases related to the Chinese New Year. Use them as a way to expand the vocabulary of your children/students when using our free printable activities.

- Ancestors: Family members from long ago, who are honored and remembered during Chinese New Year.
- Ancient: Something very old, often from a time long before now.
- Bao buns: Soft, fluffy bread rolls filled with delicious meats or vegetables, often enjoyed during celebrations.
- Blossom: A flower that blooms on trees or plants, symbolizing new beginnings and growth.
- Calligraphy: Beautiful, artistic writing done with a brush or special pen, often used to create good luck messages.
- Cantonese: A language spoken by many people in southern China and Hong Kong, often used during Chinese New Year celebrations.
- Dog: The 11th animal in the Chinese zodiac, symbolizing loyalty and kindness.
- Dragon: The 5th animal in the Chinese zodiac and a mythical creature that represents power, strength, and good luck, often seen in colorful parades during Chinese New Year.
- Dumplings: Tasty pockets of dough filled with meat or vegetables, symbolizing wealth because they look like gold coins.
- Evil Spirit Sui: A legendary spirit said to bring bad luck, chased away with loud noises during New Year's celebrations.

- Fortune: Good luck or wealth, which people wish for each other during Chinese New Year.
- Fortune Cookie: A crispy cookie with a small paper inside that shares a special message or prediction for the future.
- Goat: The 8th animal in the Chinese zodiac, symbolizing kindness and creativity.
- Grapes: A fruit often eaten during New Year for its round shape, symbolizing wealth and success.
- Handfan: A small fan often decorated with beautiful designs, used in dances or as a festive decoration.
- Happiness: A feeling of joy and celebration, shared with family and friends during Chinese New Year.



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- Hong Bao: Red envelopes filled with money, given as gifts to bring good luck and blessings.
- Horse: The 7th animal in the Chinese zodiac, symbolizing strength and freedom.
- Jade Emperor: The ruler of heaven in Chinese mythology, believed to decide the order of the Chinese zodiac animals.
- Jujube Flower Cakes: Sweet treats made with jujube fruit, symbolizing happiness and good fortune.
- Kumquats: Small citrus fruits often displayed or eaten during Chinese New Year to symbolize wealth and good luck.
- Kung Hei Fat Choy: A Cantonese greeting meaning “Wishing you great happiness and prosperity” for the New Year.
- Lantern: A decorative light often used during celebrations, especially in the Lantern Festival, marking the end of Chinese New Year.
- Legends: Stories passed down through generations, often explaining the traditions of Chinese New Year.
- Lion Dance: A traditional dance performed to bring good luck and scare away evil spirits, featuring performers in a lion costume.
- Longevity: A wish for a long and healthy life, often symbolized by certain foods like noodles.

- **Lucky:** A term used to describe good fortune, which is a major theme of Chinese New Year celebrations.

- **Mandarin:** A small orange fruit that symbolizes good fortune and abundance, often given as gifts.
- **Monkey:** The 9th animal in the Chinese zodiac, symbolizing intelligence and playfulness.
- **Moon Cake:** A round pastry filled with sweet or savory fillings, traditionally eaten during the Mid-Autumn Festival but sometimes enjoyed during New Year too.
- **Noodles:** Long noodles symbolize a wish for long life and are often served during New Year meals.
- **Ox/Oxen:** The 2nd animal in the Chinese zodiac, representing hard work and determination.
- **Peach Blossom:** A pink flower that represents love, prosperity, and new beginnings.



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- Peanut Candy: A sweet, crunchy treat symbolizing growth and vitality.
- Pig: The 12th and last animal in the Chinese zodiac, symbolizing generosity and wealth.
- Pomelo: A large citrus fruit symbolizing family unity and abundance.
- Prosperity Cakes: Steamed cakes that rise while cooking, symbolizing success and growth in the coming year.
- Rabbit: The 4th animal in the Chinese zodiac, symbolizing kindness, luck, and peace.
- Rat: The 1st animal in the Chinese zodiac, representing cleverness and quick thinking.
- Red Money Envelope: Another term for Hong Bao—red envelopes filled with money, symbolizing good luck and blessings.
- Red Packets: Small red envelopes with money inside, given to children and unmarried adults during Chinese New Year.
- Rooster: The 10th animal in the Chinese zodiac, symbolizing honesty and punctuality.
- Shrimp: A popular food during New Year, symbolizing happiness and laughter because the word for shrimp sounds like laughter in Chinese.



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- Sixteen Days: The length of Chinese New Year celebrations, starting with New Year's Eve and ending with the Lantern Festival.
- Snake: The 6th animal in the Chinese zodiac, symbolizing wisdom and grace.
- Spring Rolls: Fried or fresh rolls filled with vegetables or meat, symbolizing wealth because they look like gold bars.
- Tiger: The 3rd animal in the Chinese zodiac, symbolizing bravery and strength.
- Twelve Year Cycle: The time it takes for all the zodiac animals to have their turn in the Chinese calendar.
- Wealth: A key theme of Chinese New Year, often represented by symbols like gold coins or oranges.
- Whole Fish: Served during New Year feasts to symbolize abundance, as the word for fish sounds like "surplus" in Chinese.
- Zodiac Animals: The 12 animals representing each year in the Chinese calendar, each with its own unique traits and meanings.
